BYLAW NO. 69/71

A BYLAW TO CLASSIFY LICENSE REGULATE AND GOVERN BUSINESSES

The council of the Village of Young in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. In this bylaw the expression "transient trader" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by the Urban Municipality Act.
- 2. No person shall carry on any of the businesses set out in section 9 of this bylaw within the Village unless he possesses a valid and subsisting license for the purpose issued in accordance with the provisions of this bylaw.
- 3. The secretary-treasurer of the Village is hereby authorized to issue a license to any person carrying on the village:
 - (a) who is not assessable by the Village for the purposes of business taxation in respect of that business; and
 - (b) who makes application for such license stating specifically the nature of his business in the village; and
 - (c) who has complied with the Auctioneers Act if the same applies or may apply in respect of the license for which he has made application under this bylaw; and
 - (d) who tenders with his application the proper license fee as herein provided for.
- 4. Subject to the right of the council to suspend or revoke the same, as provided by the Urban Municipality Act, every license issued hereunder shall remain in force and effect until and including the thirty-first day of December of the year of issue.
- 5. Where a license, other than a temporary permit, is issued hereunder after September 1st of any year the fee payable under section 9 shall be reduced by 50 per cent.
- 6. Every license issued hereunder shall specifically state the kinds of services, goods or merchandise which the licensee is authorized to offer for sale or take orders for as the case may be and whether in the case of goods or merchandise, he may offer the same for sale by retail or by public auction or both. Such license shall also state the restriction as set forth in section 7 hereof.
- 7. No person to whom a license has been granted under this bylaw shall offer for sale services, goods or merchandise or solicit orders for future delivery of goods or merchandise within the Village:
 - (a) other than of a kind or kinds decribed in the license;
 - (b) by any method except as authorized therein; or
 - (c) at any time or during any period when shops within the village offering for sale or taking orders for similar services, goods or merchandise are required by village bylaw to be and remain closed.
- 8. Every person licensed under this bylaw, shall, at all reasonable times, upon request of the secretary-treasurer, the Village constable or license inspector, or any peace officer, produce such license for inspection purposes.
- 9. Subject to section 5, the fee payable for a license under this bylaw shall be as follows:
 - - (ii) For a plumbing, heating or electrical contractor or sub-contractor.....\$ 30.00

- (iv) A contractor or subcontractor in lieu of applying for a license as stated in paragraphs (i) to (iii) inclusive may apply for a temporary permit at a cost of 50% of the regular license which is valid for one job only. Having been issued one of these permits in one year, the holder can for an additional 50% be granted a regular license for the same year.

- 10. Any person who violates any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offense and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties as provided in the general penalty bylaw of the village.
- 11. Bylaw no 49/68 dated April 17th, 1968 is hereby repealed.
