Do I need a building permit?

A building permit is required in the Village of Young anytime work to be undertaken is regulated by the Saskatchewan Building Code. This includes:

- Construction of a new building
- Alterations or additions to an existing building
- Structural changes to a building
- o Installation of a mobile home or other factory constructed building
- Moving or demolishing a building or part of same
- Changing the use of a building
- Installation of foundation damp proofing and drain tile
- o Installation of or alterations to a plumbing or fire sprinkler system
- Any change to a floor plan of a commercial/public building
- Creation of new spaces within a building (e.g.: finishing a basement or building a partition wall to turn one room into two)
- o Construction of a carport or garage either attached to a residence or detached
- o Construction of sheds, gazebos, pergolas, etc. if the building is 10 square metres or larger
- o Construction of a retaining wall that retains 1.2 metres of material at its highest point
- o Construction of a deck if the deck is covered or the walking surface is 600mm above final grade at any point
- Replacement or upgrades to insulation
- o Replacement of windows
- Installation of chimneys or wood-burning appliances
- o Installation of security shutters

*This list is not comprehensive but serves as an example. Please contact the Village Office at 306-259-2242 to enquire about the need for a building permit BEFORE starting your project.

Do I need a building permit for a shed?

Building permits are required for sheds that will be 10 square metres or larger, including pre-built sheds purchased from hardware stores.

Please note that metal shipping containers are not permitted on residential properties.

When is a building permit not required?

- o Re-roofing an existing building provided no structural repairs are required
- o Re-siding a single or two-family residential dwelling
- o Normal plumbing repairs and fixture replacement in single-family dwellings
- $\circ \quad \text{New flooring within a dwelling} \\$
- Construction of a fence

*Even if your project does not need a building permit, you must still comply with the Zoning Bylaw regulations.
